These courses can be taught in blended or fully online models and include some unique elements such as an immersive reality 3D art gallery where the students curate their own art exhibit and hang the pieces in this virtual gallery. The course content lends itself to both arts and humanities classes.

Educators are invited to apply to be a part of this program, which includes a 4-week fully online PD course to help educators use the digital curriculum and curation tools. Once educators have completed the online PD, they are certified to teach using the Crystal Bridges digital content.
